Helpful Hints

Ear plugs are available on the train or in the museum spaces.

Train rides are ADA accessible. There is a wheelchair lift to assist.

With proof of EBT card, Museums 4 All discounted tickets are available.

KCLS offers free library passes for Train Shed admission.

The Train Shed is one floor and mostly paved.

Trained Service Animals are allowed.



Throughout this guide there are symbols. These symbols can tell you if a place is **loud** or **busy**, if a place has **things to touch** and **things to see**, where there are **restrooms**, and where you can have **snacks**.



This place may be **loud**.




This place may be **busy**.

Snoqualmie Depot




Railway History Campus

Snoqualmie Depot



The Snoqualmie Depot is a very old building. A **depot** is where a person can buy tickets for a train ride.

At the Depot you can:

- **Look** at the gift shop
- **Walk** around the trains
- **Play** in the freight room at the train tables
- **Look** at exhibits in the waiting room & freight room
- **Climb** in a train car
- **Board** the train with a ticket

Railway History Campus



The **Railway History Campus** has a lot of trains. There are **3 buildings** here. You can go into the **Train Shed Exhibit Hall**. It is the building in the back of the campus.

- **Pay** the Admissions Desk
- **Go** into the Gift Shop
- **Look** at exhibits & train cars
- **Play** at interactive stations
- **Complete** a scavenger hunt
- **Listen/Watch** exhibit videos
- **Climb** inside the 001 Caboose
- **Look** inside the Messenger of Peace (The Chapel Car)


Outside You Can:

- **Walk** and **find** the logging disconnects
- **Use** the restrooms
- **Eat** a snack at the picnic tables
- **Drink** from the water fountain





Riding the Train

If you are riding the train, there are **2** places you can board the train.

You can board at North Bend Depot or Snoqualmie Depot.

When You Board

- **Be careful** as you climb the steps.
- If you need the **wheelchair lift**, let the **ticket agent** know.
- **Find** your seat and **sit** down.



The **conductor** will help you board.



Car attendants can help you find a seat and answer questions.

There are **no**
bathrooms on the
train.

Riding the Train



When You Ride

- Stay **seated**
- **Ask** car attendants questions
- Do **not eat** snacks on the train
- Do **not walk between** train cars
- **Take** pictures
- **Look** out the windows



● Stop 1: North Bend Depot


● Stop 2: Snoqualmie Depot

● Stop 3: Snoqualmie Valley Overlook

● Stop 4: Train Shed (20-30 minutes)

After the Train Shed, the train
repeats the above stops in order.
